# EMPLOYMENT

### Employment Increased by 312 Thousand with the Surprise Increase in Education Sector, SME Employment Decreased by 88 Thousand

Using the Social Security Institution (SGK) data for January 2017, the 61<sup>st</sup> issue of TEPAV's Employment Monitoring Bulletin indicates that the number of employees in formal employment increased by 312 thousand in January 2017 compared to January 2016, and the number of SME employees decreased by 88 thousand.

The sector with the highest increase in the number of employees in formal employment (4/a) in January 2017 compared to January 2016 is education sector with an increase of 394 thousand. The increase in the number of employees in formal employment (4/a) was largely due to the increase in the education.

Service to buildings and landscape activities sector is the sector where the number of SME employees decreased the most with 66 thousand. This sector is followed by the construction of building sector with 58 thousand, the foresty and logging sector with 25 thousand, the land transport and transport via pipelines sector with 23 thousand, and civil engineering sector with 12 thousand.

The province in which the number of SME employees declined the most is İstanbul with a decrease of 72 thousand. İstanbul is followed by Antalya with a decrease of 23 thousand, Ankara with a decrease of 10 thousand, Eskişehir, and Nevşehir with 4 thousand each.

### General Evaluation – January 2017

Using the Social Security Institution (SGK) data for January 2017, TEPAV's Employment Monitoring Bulletin's 61st issue analyzes monthly and annual changes in the total formal employment, employment for women, merchants, farmers, and public sector employees as well as changes in the numbers of SMEs in each sector and city.

Looking at the changes in the last year, the highest decrease in January 2017 is seen in selfemployed tradesman with a decrease of 10,2 percent. In the last year, the number of farmers decreased by 10 percent, and the number of public sector employees decreased by 2,1 percent. The number of employees in formal employment increased by 2,3 percent.




Figure 1. The number of employee change (January 2017 - January 2016)

When the number of employees in formal employment (4/a), self-employed tradesmen (4/b), farmers (4/b) and public sector employees (4/c) are taken as equal to 100 in October 2008, the values become 152,8 for employees in formal employment (4/a), 94,6 for self-employed merchants (4/b), 62,7 for farmers (4/b), and 135,8 for public servants in January 2017.




Figure 2. The number of employee according to months(October 2008=100)



### EMPLOYMENT MONITORING BULLETIN

#### Employment increased by 312 thousand in One Year

The number of employees in formal employment in January 2017 is 13 million 933 thousand with a 2,3 percent increase compared to January 2016. The seasonally adjusted series indicate that the number of employees increased by 207 thousand compared to December 2016.

The highest increase was in the education sector with 394 thousand, and 58,3 percent. Education sector is followed by manufacture of fabricated metal products with an increase of 46 thousand, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers with an increase of 18 thousand and employment activities with an increase of 17 thousand. The sector with the fastest increase in the number of its employees is education with a 58,3 percent. Employment activities follow this sector, with a 37,9 percent increase. These sectors are further followed by public administration and defence; compulsory social security with a 26 percent increase and sectors of other professional scientific and technical activities with a 25,4 percent increase.

### Forestry and Logging is the Sector with the Fastest Decrease in Employment in One Year

In January 2017, although the sectors in total witnessed an increase of 312 thousand, the number of employees in formal employment saw an decrease in 43 sectors in comparison to the figures of January 2016. Among the 43 sectors with a decrease in the number of employees in formal employment, the 10 sectors with the largest decreases are shown in Table 5. The highest decrease was in services to buildings and landscape activities sector with 95 thousand. Manufacturing industry sectors constitute 3 out of the 10 sectors where employment decreased the most in a year. The fastest decrease is in the forestry and logging sector with 63,3 percent.

### Employment Increased by 26 Thousand in One Year, and 32 Thousand in One Month in the Manufacturing Industry

In January 2017, the number of employees in the manufacturing industry increased by 26 thousand (0,7 percent) compared to January 2016. Seasonally adjusted series show a increase of 32 thousand in the number of employees in the manufacturing industry compared to December 2016.


There was an increase in the number of employees 10 of the 24 manufacturing industry sectors, compared to January 2016. The highest increase was in the manufacture of fabricated metal products with 46 thousand. Manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers sector follows with 18 thousand and the manufacture of electrical equipment sector with 5 thousand. The number of employees increased the fastest in the manufacture of fabricated metal products with 11,7 percent.

### Şırnak is the Province with the Fastest Increase in Employment

Compared to last year, the number of employees increased in 50 provinces and decreased in 31 provinces in January 2017. The highest increase took place in İstanbul with 46 thousand. İzmir (45 thousand), Bursa (40 thousand) and Kocaeli (21 thousand) follow İstanbul. Employment increased the fastest in Şırnak with 72,4 percent, followed by Hakkari, Van, and Osmaniye. In Antalya, the province with the highest decrease in the number of employees, the decrease in employment in a year is 34 thousand.





### Female Employment Increased by 182 Thousand in a Year

In January 2017, the number of female employees in formal employment increased by 182 thousand (4,8 percent). Seasonally adjusted series show an increase of 209 thousand in the number of female employees in formal employment since December 2016.

Compared to last year, the highest increase took place in the education sector with 209 thousand, followed by human health activities with 11 thousand, office administrative, office support and other business support activities with 9 thousand. The number of female employees in formal employment increased the fastest in the education sector with 52,1 percent.

### Female Employment Decreased by 1 Thousand in One Year In the Manufacturing Industry

In January 2017, the number of female employees in formal employment increased in 13 manufacturing sectors and decreased in 11 manufacturing sectors compared to last year. The number of female employees decreased by 1 thousand compared to January 2016. Seasonally adjusted series show a increase of 4 thousand in the number of female employees compared to December 2016.

The highest increase took place in the manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers sector with 5 thousand, followed by manufacture of fabricated metal products, and other manufacturing sectors. Compared to January 2016, the number of female employees increased the fastest in manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers sector with 17,8 percent.

### İstanbul is the Province where Number of Female Employees in Formal Employment Increased the Most

In January 2017, the number of female employees in formal employment increased by 182 thousand compared to January 2016. Seasonally adjusted series show that the number of female employees increased by 209 thousand compared to December 2016.

The highest increase took place in the provinces of İstanbul with 38 thousand, followed by İzmir (19 thousand), Bursa (18 thousand), and Ankara (14 thousand). The number of female employees increased the fastest in Şırnak with 76,3 percent, followed by Van, Ağrı, Mardin, and Hatay.

### The Number of Companies Decreased in 44 Sectors

The number of companies was 1 million 728 thousand with a 1 percent (17 thousand) increase compared to January 2016 in January 2017. Seasonally adjusted series show that the number of workplaces increased by 3 thousand between December 2016 and January 2017.

The highest increase took place in real estate activities with 6 thousand in comparison to January 2016, followed by retail trade, wholesale trade, education, and food and beverage service activities sectors. The number of companies increased the fastest in public administration and defence, compulsory social security with 81,7 percent. This sector is followed by employment activities and mining support service activities.

### The Number of Companies Increased in 72 Provinces

Compared to last year, the number of companies increased in 72 provinces and decreased in 9 provinces in January 2017. In January 2017, the number of companies increased by 17 thousand (1 percent) when compared to January 2016.

The largest increase took place in Kocaeli, Bursa, Van, and Trabzon with 1 thousand each, followed by Şırnak, Kahramanmaraş, Diyarbakır, and Tekirdağ. The number of companies increased the fastest in Şırnak with 77,2 percent, followed by Van, Bingöl, Iğdır and Muş.

#### The Number of SMEs Increased by 17 Thousand in a Year

The number of small and medium sized enterprises increased by 17 thousand in January 2017 compared to January 2016. Seasonally adjusted series indicate that the number of SMEs increased by 2 thousand compared to December 2016.

The highest increase took place in Kocaeli, Bursa, Van, and Trabzon with one thousand each, followed by Şırnak, Kahramanmaraş, Diyarbakır, and Tekirdağ. Sectoral data show that the fastest increase took place in public administration and defence, compulsory social security sector with 83,7 percent, followed by employment activities, mining support service activities, and manufacture of tobacco products sectors.

# The Number of SME Employees Decreased by 88 Thousand in One Year

The number of small and medium sized enterprises employee decreased by 88 thousand in January 2017 compared to January 2016. Seasonally adjusted series indicate that the number of SME employees increased by 17 thousand compared to December 2016.

The highest increase took place in Şırnak with 10 thousand, followed by Van (8 thousand), Tekirdağ (7 thousand), Mersin, and Manisa (5 thousand), Hatay (4 thousand). Sectoral data show that the fastest increase took place in public administration and defence, compulsory social security sector with 38,9 percent, followed by education, manufacture of tobacco products, and mining of metal ores sectors.

### The Number of Tradesmen Decreased by 204 Thousand in One Year

The recorded number of tradesmen are 1 million 807 thousand with a 204 thousand (10,2 percent) decrease in January 2017 when compared to January 2016. Seasonally adjusted series indicate an decrease of 177 thousand in the number of tradesmen compared to December 2016.

The highest decrease took place in Istanbul with 60 thousand, followed by Ankara, Antalya, İzmir and Bursa. The number of tradesman decreased the fastest in Şırnak with 21,4 percent, followed by Adıyaman, Zonguldak, Hakkari, and Ankara.
