
EU actions for Van earthquakes

- © EU direct grant to the Turkish Red Crescent: EUR 4 million
- = 1,200 temporary housing units for 6,000 persons.
- © 20 participating states (UK, IE, DE, FR, BE, LU, ES, IT, SE, DK, RO, BG, AT. SK, SI, FI, NL, PL, CZ, EE)
- **©** = 8,000 family tents for 50,000 persons
- © 12 humanitarian/civil protection specialists and engineers to the Van Province and Erzurum airport






Global Official Humanitarian Contributions








In the EU, a growing role for the European Commission: humanitarian spending, 1994-2010





The path of European humanitarian action: follow the needs
























Horn of Africa/ Turkey + OIC among top donors


OCHA FTS: Humanitarian aid to Horn of Africa crisis as of Feb 2012


Turkish GNI and Aid
