

Administrative Procedures Act

Strict disciplines
Public knows what the government is doing
Public has input into the government policy process

Inter-Agency Process

 Addresses cross-cutting agency issues

Avoids duplication

Benefits of Transparency

 more practical and workable policies

 higher level of trust and confidence in the government

Origins of Policy

 Congress makes laws that the Executive Branch must implement

- President directs agencies to prepare policy
- Petitions from the public

Need identified by agencies to meet a stated objective

Collecting Information to Write Policy

Information sought from many sources:

Congressional intent
 Private sector especially the affected industry or persons
 Consumers

Other Federal and state agencies

Collecting Information

 Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published in the Federal Register

Public meeting open to everyone

Meetings with interested groups
Government in the Sunshine Act

• Meet with Federal and State agencies

Proposed Regulation

Subject to inter-agency review in U.S. government

 Published in the Federal Register, which is available to everyone

Proposed Regulation

 Process established for receiving official public comment that becomes part of the record

Press release to the general media

Preparing the Final Regulation

- Agency analyzes public comments
- Must assure policy will be workable and effective.
- Final regulation published in the Federal Register with a summary of comments from the public and the rationale for the Agency's decisions.
- May be accompanied by educational workshops.

U.S. Codex Office Process

Transparent development of U.S. positions on Codex issues:

 Distribution lists of interested parties

 Intra-governmental meetings
 Public meetings before every Committee meeting

U.S. Codex Office Process

Transparent development of U.S. positions on Codex issues:
Policy and Technical Committees resolve differences

 Delegate reports of Committee meetings

Benefits of Transparency

 "No secrets" fosters confidence and trust in the government

 General agreement on a workable program


More likely to achieve objectives
